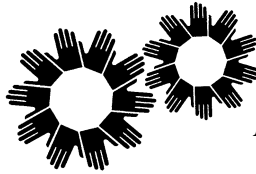

Thank you for your interest in the Workshops, Inc. Junior Board! The purpose of the Junior Board of Workshops, Inc. is to promote the name and business services of Workshops, Inc. in the Birmingham business community. Through marketing and special events, the Junior Board enhances opportunities for persons receiving services at Workshops and the revenue available to Workshops, Inc., thereby enabling an array of important services to people with disabilities.

Membership is for a two year term, and if desired members can request re-election at the end of their term. The Junior Board seeks young professionals, age 22 to 40, who want to become more involved in the community and who have a particular interest in ensuring that people with disabilities receive quality services to help them achieve independence. The Junior Board meets monthly on the second Tuesday at 6:00 pm.

About Workshops, Inc.:

Workshops, Inc. provides job training and employment services for people who have significant disabilities. People receiving services earn wages by performing assembly, packaging, printing, bindery and mailing services. Some earn their living while receiving training in reception, food services, building maintenance, warehousing, materials handling, fork lift operation, local delivery and other activities.

The agency has been in continuous operation since 1900 and takes pride in its business services that provide a majority of the organization's annual income. United Way of Central Alabama, the Alabama Department of Rehabilitation Services and private donations also fund operations.

With a work force of over two hundred people, Workshops, Inc. can handle up to five million units of material per month. In 2010, the agency worked with about 600 business customers from 350 companies in Jefferson and Shelby Counties. The jobs completed for our customers translate into employment in the community. In a typical year, Workshops assists over 100 people to obtain competitive jobs with area employers. Workshops also provides ongoing employment to dozens of individuals with significant disabilities. In all, about 400 people receive training or other vocational services at Workshops each year.

Workshops, Inc. is a 501(c)(3), not-for-profit organization dedicated to the principle that work and employment provide the opportunity to be like others, to contribute and maintain a rewarding life.
